

Departments

Bengali

The Department of Bengali was set up in 1968. Starting from the journey it was general department. The honours subject was introduced since 19.... So, this department offered Bengali honours course as well as general course. The department always encourage and guide their students for consistency progress in their result and other academic activities. Right from inception, the special emphasis of the faculty has been on strengthening the system of learning in Bengali language and literature. General course and Honours course was introduced in 19 and 19 respectively. Department is having with Departmental room and shares all other central infrastructure of the college. English

Department of English was established along with the inception of Vidyanagar College on 29th July, 1963. It was one of the few earliest active departments of the institution. In the beginning, the department was catering to the +2 students and the Compulsory Language Paper to the Under Graduate students. English as a General subject in the Under Graduate Courses (B.A) was introduced in session 2003-04. Stalwarts like Prof. Majushree Banerjee, Prof. Biswanath Kayal, Prof. Moloy Ranjan Dey and Prof. Somnath Basu worked in the Department as Faculty members in the past. At present the Department is headed by Prof. Subrata Sar. Prof. Sahidur Rahaman Lasker, Prof. Ankita Adhikary and Prof. Pritthwish Das are working as faculty members of the department under the leadership of Prof. Subrata Sar.

The department started offering B.A English Honours in the institution three years later in session 2006-07. Since then, the Department has been active in offering courses in all newer models of curriculum. The Honours course commenced its journey with B.A (2+1) yearly system followed by (1+1+1) curriculum and CBCS (6 semesters) curriculum. From session 2023-24, the department is following the NEP-CCF 2022 curriculum in offering the U.G courses. At present, there is a sanction to accommodate only 47 candidates for the Honours course. The Department also plays an important role in offering (D.D.E R.B.U) M.A in English as a P.G degree course since the session 2006-07.

History

The Department of History of Vidyanagar College was established on 29th of July 1963 with Prof. Sachidananda Sarkar and Dr. Sasanka Shekhar Parui. History was taught in the Higher Secondary section of the college initially. At the undergraduate level initially, it was taught as a General Course. **Honours course** was initiated in 2002. It was enriched with dedicated teachers who always tried their level best for academic upliftment of students. Teachers of the Dept. used to participate in College Seminars, workshops, various cultural programmes, sports, seminars of different academic institutions and published articles in reputed journals etc. It must be added that a vibrant atmosphere always prevails in this department undoubtedly. Intake capacity of the department is 50 in Hons and 100 in General.

Philosophy

The department of Philosophy of VIDYANAGAR COLLEGE was established in the year 1963. It is one of the foremost departments of the college. The department nurtures young minds to grow as fine human resources inculcating in them, rational, critical and progressive outlook with moral and social values. It is our challenge to cultivate our students as budding philosophers; inquirers of knowledge and ethical analyst of issues pertaining to society, evolving to become a practical applicant of moral values in life and above all a true human being. The philosophy department of the college has consistently excelled in academics and co-curricular activities. At present, we have two permanent faculty members and one State Aided College Teacher. The faculty members of the department are always devoted to teaching and learning process and to give every student a space to grow and realize their potentialities. We are highly concern of completion of the syllabus within stipulated time and transparent internal evaluation. We regularly organize students' seminar, group discussion etc. to train up the students, of the department 'how seminar paper should be presented', 'what is academic writing', 'how to appear in and present oneself in group discussion', 'how seminar paper can be presented with the help of audio-visual aids etc. We invite faculty members from other department and organize interdisciplinary lectures for students to develop comprehensive understanding of philosophical issues.

Political Science

The Department of Political Science began its humble journey along with the college in the year 1963. It offered courses in the plus two and in the undergraduate level as a pass subject. Though there were no shortage in the number of students in the plustwo and the undergraduate (pass) level, there was a fall in the year 2000 when the College had to, I discontinue the plus-two courses, following government policy. However, the demand for Political Science as a combination-subject in the undergraduate level continued to grow among the students. The introduction of Honours course in the year 2003 was an important step for the College as a whole and for the Department in particular. No longer have the students passing out from the nearby schools and aspiring to study Political Science Honours had to seek admission to far off colleges. We have Started late-a long wait for forty years to introduce the Honours courses, but with vigour.

Sociology

The Department of Sociology of Vidyanagar College was established in the year 19.... This major focuses on sociological perspectives as they are related to social structure, social institutions, social inequality, and the solution to social problems. The Department of Sociology is one of the activity-oriented departments in the School of Liberal Arts and Culture Studies which provides students sociological perspective to develop a critical understanding of society. Excellent infrastructure having well equipped classrooms and library facilities. Seminars and conferences are arranged regularly for exposure of students to the national and international debates of sociological relevance.

Education

Vidyanagar College was established on 29th June, 1963 in order to provide quality education to the local students. Unlike many other subjects Department of Education was inaugurated in the year 2006. The department commenced its journey under the able leadership of Prof. Soma Mukhopadhyay and Prof. Anita Saha. Currently Prof. Samir Ghosh leads the department along with the able accompaniment of Prof. Riya Bhattacharjee.

Presently, the Department offers General courses for the Under Graduate Students. The department commenced with a sanction of 70 students more than 17 years ago. Presently it has university permission to allot ______ no. of seats to the students. A huge number of students prefer Education because of the able management of the department and the career driven aspects of the subject.

Botany

The Department of Botany was established in the year 1994, at the time of introduction of B.Sc. (Two-year Pass) course in the College. Since its inception, the Department has distinguished itself with consistently good performance of the students in the University Examinations. Subsequently, the department has made rapid progress, not only in infrastructure, but also in the number of enrolled enthusiastic students. Furthermore, good performance of the students at the degree level has made this department a highly desirable educational sink. Over the years, the alumni of this department have proved their potential and held different positions various Government and Non-Government Academic and in Research establishments of India. Departmental laboratories have been upgraded with modern equipments and teaching aids with the developmental grants from RUSA. A Medicinal Plants Garden (Vesojo-Bitan) consisting of many species of medicinal herbs, shrubs and trees has been established in the college campus under the aegis of this department with a view to disseminate knowledge to the students and other interested people of the area.

Chemistry

Though the College was built in 1968, Department of Chemistry started its journey way back in 1978. Initially the College was allowed to teach the Higher Secondary (10+2) curriculum. The two-year B.Sc. General degree course in Physical Science was approved in 1983. The first post of Chemistry was created in 1978 and Dr. Nilanjan Basu was appointed as Lecturer in 1979. Sri Dwijendra Nath Samanta was appointed as Graduate Laboratory Instructor in 1985.

The Choice Base Credit System (CBCS) was introduced in 2019 and the Curriculum & Credit Framework (UG) under the New Education Policy (NEP) was introduced in 2023. The Department utilizes classes in both white board-marker as well audio-visual through projector mode. A well-defined Chemistry Laboratory is there for Practical classes. Two new Laboratories with modern equipments and teaching aids are going to be built shortly in the first floor of New Building. The Department of Chemistry organized a 30 hours value added Add-on course.

Economics

The Department of Economics has been existing in the College since 5th August 1963. Prpf. Rabindranath Bhattacherjee joined the Department as the first full-time lecturer. At the time, this institution offered three-years bachelor degree in Pass Course affiliated to the University of Calcutta. So, Economics was offered as a Pass Course subject. At the pre-university level Economics and Political Science wewe offered as a combined subject. In the beginning the subject was taught at the B.A./B.Sc. and B.Com. (General) level. From 1976 to 2001, the Department also offered the Higher Secondary courde. Honours in Economics was introduced in 2001.

Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics in Vidyanagar College is functioning since the session 1977-78. The first post of the department was created to teach Higher Secondary (science) students only. Dr. Utpal Chatterjee joined the department as the first full-time lecturer. In the session 1983-84, B.Sc. (General) course was opened. B.Sc. (Hons) course was started from session 2002-2003. Now the department has a glory with five lecturers. The professors try to maintain friendly and helpful relationship with all the students irrespective of their background. The alumni of this department have continued to glorify different positions in various Academics and Research Institutes of India, as well as in various designated post of Govt. and Private sectors. The department include an add-on programme and arranged some seminers for students.

Physics

The Department of Physics of Vidyanagar College was set up as a part of the Department of Science in the year 1978 for promotion and growth of Science in the adjoining rural areas of the college. The mission was to bring the students' attention to Science and give them a chance to learn Physics at Higher Secondary level. Then, there were no institution in the nearby villages to teach Science even at H.S level. Later in the year of 1983, the B.Sc. (General) course in Physics was introduced. The Departmental Laboratory is located on the 1st floor of Science Building covering an area of about 1700 sq. ft. And a very modern style Dark Room is located on the same floor of Science Building covering area of about 200 sq. ft. The Department is equipped with modern up-to-date Practical Instruments. Seminar and Lectures by eminent Scientists are frequently arranged in the Department to orient young minds towards Science. And few Add-On Courses were also arranged by the Department. The Department has served the students of poor socio-economic background, and lived up to its reputation of teaching Science to the students, most of whom were first generation learner. The alumni of this Department have continued to glorify different positions in various Academic Institutes, as well as in various post of Govt. and Private sectors.

Zoology

The Department of Zoology of Vidyanagar College was seeded as Dept. of Biological sciences in Vidyanagar College in the year 1977. The vice principal and teacher in charge Professor K.C Adhikari, then administrator professor Amitesh Chakraborty and the MLA Mr. Prabhas Roy took initiative in introducing science stream in the college. Later on, Dr. Subodh Chowdhury took the post of Principal in 1983-84 and enriched the department with his endeavor. In 1994-95 sessions DPI, Govt. of West Bengal sanctioned B.Sc (Bio Science) Zoology and Botany as pass subject. Then Principal Dr. Amar Basu Mallick, vice Principal Prof. K.C Adhikari and the members of governing body took active role in introducing the subjects. Dr. Arabinda Ghosh took the charge of the department since inception of the B.Sc courses. In 1997 Dr. Surja Prakash Agarwala joined the department as a faculty member and participated in flourishing the department. Honours course was introduced with Dr. Arabinda Ghosh and Dr. Surja Prakash Agarwala on the session of 2010-2011. The alumni of this department have continued to glorify different positions in various Academics and Research Institutes of India, as well as in various designated post of Govt. and Private sectors. Over the financial years, the Dept. of Zoology has received Developmental grants from RUSA. As a result, effort has been to upgrade the laboratories with modern equipments and teaching aids. The departmental Seminar Library has also been enriched with CBCS and NEP syllabus-oriented books.

Environmental studies

The department was established in 2019. The Environmental studies department of Vidyanagar College is open for all the students as the subject is taught as compulsory for all bachelor degree students. The classes of this subject is very much practical problem-solution oriented. The students become more aware about the impact of their small acts. There are no Honours or General courses in this department, only compulsory paper. But some students have been motivated so much by the subject that they have chosen it as the subject of their higher studies. The teachers try to maintain friendly and helpful relationship with all the students irrespective of their background. Some activities are also organised by the teachers along with the students to impart practical approach to help sustain the include environment. The activities tree plantation, plastic collection. practical excursions etc. Other activities organised by the department include add-on programme based on life-skill such as, "impacts of climate change on human health" and also individual project works, for which certificates are issued for each and every student.

Commerce

Library

Vidyanagar College Library is situated at ground floor of auditorium building of the Vidyanagar College. The library has an enviable collection of text and reference books (more than 26,000), various national and international journals, periodicals, magazines and newspapers covering all parameters. Both open and closed access systems have been maintained simultaneously in the library. The library is fully automated with Integrated Library Management Software Koha. All the documents available in the library are barcode based and can be searched in Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). The library also subscribes to various e-Resources through UGC INFLIBNET N-LIST programme, where users can access e-journals and e-books. The College Library is the institutional member of British Council Library, Kolkata. The library has a good collection of non-book materials too, such as map, CD, etc. Internet facility is also available and users are encouraged to access millions of open access journals and databases. The entire library is Wi-Fi enabled. This facility has been provided for library users. The library is under CCTV Surveillance.

Registration, fees and Refund procedure

Calcutta University and College Rules

- Students are required to maintain regular attendance to be eligible for appearing in the University Examination. They should follow the parameters given below: Attendance
 - i. A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes^{*} held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
 - ii. A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
 - iii. A student attending at least 60% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he/she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, wichever is later.

- 2. If a student is absent for more than two weeks without prior permission/intimation, his/her name is likely to be struck of the register.
- 3. Science students who do not attend theoritical classes regularly shall not be permitted to attend practical classes.
- 4. Students must pass the college examinations for being sent up for University Examinations.

Any student **absent in any examination on medical grounds** must submit before the end of the examination or within three days of its completion a Medical Certificate and a letter to the Vice-Principal from the guradian stating the ground for his/her absence. Such cases may be considered with sympathy, but it must be understood that **illness is not in itself a valid excuse**.

Sending up, in such cases, will not be granted unless the student's record is very good. Sending-up lists are displayed on the Notice Board.

5. Students must wear and display visibly their Identity Cards during college hours inside the campus. In case of loss of Identity Card, a duplicate can be obtained only with the permission of the Principal/Vice-Principal and on payment of a fine of Rs. 70/-.

- 6. A student failing to clear the fees within the notified date will have to secure re-admission on payment of full fees again with the prior approval of the Principal/Vice-Principal.
- 7. Students are expected to treat the members of the staff and their fellow students with courtesy both in and out of the college. There must be no disorderly or offensive conduct at any time.
- 8. Student must be in their classes and take their seats at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission.
- 9. College property, furniture, library books, etc. must be treated with due care.
- 10. Rules for the conduct of examinations placed on the Notice Board must be strictly observed.
- 11. Impersonation at roll-call is a punishable offence.
- 12. Students are required to check the Notice Board for important announcements.
- 13. Students are expected to be formally and decently dressed while in the college.
- 14. Smoking, chewing tobacco products, playing cards, spitting and loitering are strictly prohibited inside the college & hostel campus and shall invite severe punishment/disciplinary action.

Library Rules:

- 1. All students of the college are eligible for membership of the library.
- 2. Students must observe strict silence in the library.
- 3. Identity Card is mandatory while visiting and using the library.
- Honours (B.A./B.Sc./ B.COM) Students can borrow maximum two books, General (B.A./ B.Sc./ B.COM.) Students can borrow maximum one book from the general section. The maximum lending period is 15 calendar days. Teaching Staff and Non-Teaching Staff Members can borrow books as per requirement.
- 5. If a student retains a book beyond the maximum permitted period, a fine is imposed at the rate of Rs. 1.00 (One Rupee only) per day beyond the maximum period.
- 6. Absence from the college is not accepted as an excuse for not returing the book(s) in time.
- 7. Borrowers are responsible for the books which stand against their names. If a book is found damaged at the time of issue, it must be brought to the notice of the Librarian. If the damage is detected at the time of return, the borrower is to compensate for the damage.
- 8. Sub-lending or transferring of books to another person's name is not permitted.
- Any loss of books must be immediately reported to the Librarian. The borrower is liable to pay the defult fine, if any, till the date of such report. He/she will be held responsible for replacing the lost book or paying the cost of replacement of the book.
- 10. The Librarian has the authority to call back any book at any time. If not returned within the stipulated time, a penalty will be imposed.
- 11. A fine of Rs. 50.00 (Rupees seventy only) will be imposed for issue of duplicate Library/Identity card.

- 12. Reference Books, Rare Books, Journals, Newspapers, Magazines will not be issued.
- 13. Library clearance is mandatory. Library clearance is checked out by the library administration before issuing admit card of final University examination. All students must return the borrowed books. Admit cards will be issued only after the clearance from the library.

FUNDAMENTAL DUTIES OF THE CITIZEN Constitution of India

Part-IVA Fundamental Duties

51 A. Fundamental duties- It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-

- 1. To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem.
- 2. To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom.
- 3. To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India.
- 4. To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so.
- 5. To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women.
- 6. To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture.
- 7. To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures.
- 8. To develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform.
- 9. To safeguard public property and to abjure violence.
- 10. To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavor and achievement.
- 11. Duty of all parents/guardians to send their children in the age group of 6-14 years to school.
